Jill's Story, Diagnosed at 34 with Stage IV Bladder Cancer

Jill was diagnosed with Stage IV bladder cancer at just 34 years of age. She told BCAN:

"When the doctor told me that I had late stage bladder cancer, I heard him talking to me but it was like I was outside of my body. I learned that I had stage IV cancer and the doctor recommended that I have my bladder removed. My head was spinning. There was no discussion of chemotherapy; my bladder had to come out. He might have considered other therapies before, but the doctor I bladder cancer patients, particularly during our year end giving appeal and our Virtual Walks to End Bladder Cancer.
