Every May, we celebrate <u>Bladder</u> <u>Cancer Awareness Month</u> (BCAM)

and take full advantage of the opportunity to raise awareness of this terrible disease, one that has struck more than 600,000 people in the United States. More than 500 people registered to watch the live event with **Dr. Kent Mouw** of the Dana Farber Cancer Institute and **Dr. Sarah Psutka** of the University of Washington - both of whom were BCAN <u>Young</u> <u>Investigator Awardees</u> earlier in their careers.

In the days leading up to the event, BCAN received more than **200 questions** for our experts and the moderator, <u>Diane Zipursky Quale</u>, did her best to get to as many questions as possible during the hour-long broadcast.
