# Michael's Story: Cancer Not Just Once, But Twice

Bladder cancer is an insidious disease and has a high rate of recurrence. Michael Morigi of Staten Island, NY, has had bladder cancer. And prostate cancer. Bladder cancer was his first bout with the "Big C."

In 2009, Michael was feeling off. He described it as a strange, "itchy" feeling in his stomach. He would continually scratch his stomach but the sensation would not go away.

During a routine physical, his doctor told him that they had found blood in his urine, microscopic <u>hematuria</u>, which is not visible to the naked eye. On a date that is etched in the memories of many bladder cancer patients, Michael remembers the exact day that he got his diagnosis. It was December 31, 2009. His doctor looked at him and said, "You have <u>bladder cancer</u>."
