In March of 2014, Allen was diagnosed with stage two bladder cancer.

He told BCAN, "One part of me was thinking, 'This is not really happening,'

and another saying, 'Wow. I didn't expect that.' Like with death or any other life-altering experience, you go through those stages of grief. Anger, denial, acceptance, and it takes you a while to work through it."
