

Understanding TURBTs

A TURBT (trans urethral resection of bladder tumor) is an outpatient surgical procedure to remove a bladder tumor. Doctors use a resectoscope, which is a tool with a small electrified loop of wire at the end that can resect (remove) a bladder tumor.
