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#### National Cancer Institute | Cancer Survivor

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#### What is Cancer Survivorship?

- Thanks to early detection and new treatments, more people are living longer with cancer.
- According to the National Cancer Institute (NCI), survivorship starts the day someone
  receives a cancer diagnosis. It continues during and after treatment and throughout
  the end of life.
- In cancer survivorship, healthcare providers monitor and manage the changes that people experience, from cancer diagnoses, treatment and beyond
- Cancer survivorship emphasizes the health, well-being and quality of life of people living with a cancer Active or Cured.
- Not everyone identifies themselves as a cancer survivor from the beginning of diagnosis and that is ok.

#### Survivorship - Current Offerings

Clinic Appts. are performed virtually or at the Wellness Center – Arnold Building


- The Survivorship clinic is offering appointments, both in person and Telemedicine 3 days a week.
  - The largest source of referrals currently is Self Referral.
  - There are a few referrals coming from outside PCPs, Oncologists, Specialists UW and elsewhere.
  - Pts being seen in the clinic are at all phases of their diagnostic journeys.
  - Pts are being seen in follow up as needed varying from 3 months 1 year
  - You are required to be in the state of Washington for your visit.
  - Most insurance plans consider this a necessary visit for individuals who have been diagnosed and received treatment for cancer; prior to appointment.

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
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
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#### What is addressed in a cancer Survivorship visit?

- Physical issues that present during treatment that are persisting and concerns that may present several months or years after treatment late effects.
  Lymphedema, Neuropathy, Cognitive, Pain, Insomnia, fertility, Sexual concerns.
  Emotional and psychological concerns –
- - Anxiety, Depression, Fear of recurrence
- Social issues
  - Family, Support, Financial, Work related
- What you can do to help prevent and support your journey. the things you can control.
- A care plan the road map/check list
  - Individualized based on the type of cancer, treatments, age and other factors such as comorbidities and previous diagnoses.



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Control the things you can control... How do you promote prevention going forward?

- Keep up with other health checks and control BP, cholesterol, blood sugar, weight
- Quit smoking
- Nutrition is vital
- Exercise
- Addressing emotional needs, managing stress
- Alcohol and substance abuse
- $\bullet$  Sleep critical for physical, emotional well-being, immune function and coping


