The Bladder Cancer Advocacy Network (BCAN) is a community of patients, caregivers, survivors, advocates, medical and research professionals united in support of people impacted by bladder cancer.

Bladder cancer continued to impact thousands of patients and their families in 2023, with more than 82,000 new diagnoses. Recognizing the urgency, BCAN redoubled its efforts to support today's patients and fund tomorrow's promising medical research.

To that end, we reinforced our commitment to advancing bladder cancer research by awarding two Research Innovation Awards, one Career Development Award, five Young Investigator Awards, and eight John Quale Travel Fellowships in 2023.

Expanding our marketing and communications activities was also a key focus, ensuring that more bladder cancer patients are aware of BCAN's vital educational programs and support services. Additionally, our signature Walks to End Bladder Cancer raised over \$820,000, enabling us to sustain our crucial mission.

BCAN continued to expand its free resources and information to address the critical challenges faced by bladder cancer patients and their loved ones. Among our accomplishments was the launch of a toll-free support line for bladder cancer patients, caregivers, and the bereaved. Staffed by trained oncology social workers, callers receive information about BCAN's programs, advice on managing financial toxicity, and referrals to other helpful resources.

We express our heartfelt gratitude to our generous donors and corporate partners. None of our accomplishments in 2023 would have been possible without their unwavering support, which has made a meaningful impact on the lives of bladder cancer patients and those who love them.

As we reflect on the achievements of 2023, we reiterate our commitment to addressing the needs of patients and their loved ones. Together, we will continue to strive for more and better tomorrows.

PATIENT INSIGHT WEBINARS

BCAN's Patient Insight Webinars provide a dynamic and accessible platform for participants to engage with expert-led presentations on critical aspects of bladder cancer, including diagnosis, treatment, and quality of life. Featuring renowned specialists from urology, radiation oncology, medical oncology, and other fields, these webinars cover an extensive array of topics. In 2022, BCAN hosted 10 impactful webinars that included topics about life after radical cystectomy, understanding muscle-invasive and non-muscle-invasive bladder cancer, and addressing sexual health concerns post-bladder cancer.

COFFEE & CONVERSATIONS

Virtual Coffee and Conversations sessions connect patients and families, foster local communities, and provide valuable knowledge about bladder cancer treatment resources in their area. These personalized, online presentations showcase bladder cancer experts who are regionally based. Through Zoom, patients have the opportunity to interact with and inquire about available resources at their hospitals or medical practices from their local medical professionals.

TREATMENT TALKS

Treatment Talks are interactive Zoom sessions that dive into bladder cancer treatment options and essential topics. Each session highlights a medical expert who offers a brief overview of a specific treatment and a patient who shares their personal experience with that treatment. Following the discussion, attendees can participate in a live Q&A session with the experts. To ensure no detail is missed, a comprehensive transcript of the call is provided, capturing frequently asked questions and their answers.


BLADDER CANCER AWARENESS MONTH



2023 Bladder Cancer Research Innovation Award

Since 2009, the Bladder Cancer Advocacy Network (BCAN) has invested millions in bladder cancer research. In 2023 alone, \$1,241,000 was awarded through one Career Development Award (\$250,000), two Innovation Awards (\$300,000 each), four Young Investigator Awards (\$75,000 each) and eight John Quale Travel Fellowships (\$2,000 each). The BCAN Bladder Cancer Research Innovation Awards fund high-risk, high-reward projects with the potential to achieve groundbreaking advancements in our understanding of bladder cancer. The 2023 awardees were:

Christopher Garris, PhD, Assistant Professor, Pathology, Center for Systems Biology, Massachusetts General Hospital. Research: Overcoming immune suppressive myeloid cell barriers in bladder cancer

John Taylor, MD, MS, Professor, Urology; Co-Leader, Drug Discovery Development & Experimental Therapeutics. Research: Exploring therapeutic vulnerabilities for drug development in bladder cancer using Down Syndrome as a novel model

The 2023 Bladder Cancer Think Tank scientific meeting (TT23) took place in Washington, DC, from August 2-4, 2023. BCAN once again brought together a diverse group of clinicians, researchers, patient and caregiver advocates, and industry partners with a shared mission to create more and better tomorrows for bladder cancer patients and loved ones.


