Major News for Veterans: Bladder Cancer Recognized in PACT Act Interim Final Rule

At BCAN, one of our top <u>advocacy</u> <u>priorities</u> is ensuring veterans and service members with bladder cancer receive the health care and benefits they deserve. In 2024, we proudly led efforts to advocate for the recognition of **bladder cancer as a service-connected condition** for veterans exposed to burn pits under the PACT Act.



We are delighted to announce that our collective efforts have yielded incredible results. Today, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) issued an Interim Final Rule (IFR) **establishing a "Presumptive Service Connection for Bladder, Ureter, and Related Genitourinary Cancers Due to Exposure to Fine Particulate Matter."** Once the interim period ends and comments are received, the final rule will be published.

This monumental achievement was made possible thanks to the unwavering support

and dedication of our patient and caregiver community, scientific experts, and industry partners. Together, we have taken a significant step forward in ensuring that veterans receive the care and recognition they have earned.

We'll be sharing more detailed information about the ruling and its impact on our community in the coming days.

This \$300,000 funding opportunity supports groundbreaking ideas that address critical gaps in bladder cancer research and advance patient care.

Independent investigators with a medical or doctoral degree in the U.S. or Canada are eligible to apply, and researchers from outside the bladder cancer field are encouraged to participate.
