



Bladder Cancer Risk Factors: Understanding the Causes



While the exact causes of bladder cancer are not fully understood, certain behaviors and environmental exposures are known to increase the risk. Some factors are beyond your control, while



others can be managed.

Smoking is a major risk factor, as it introduces harmful toxins into the bladder. Workplace exposure to specific chemicals can also raise the risk. Additionally, genetics, age, sex and race may influence your likelihood of developing bladder cancer. If you're experiencing symptoms, it's important to identify the cause to determine whether bladder cancer could be the underlying issue.
